

UPCYCLING INSTEAD OF TEXTILE WASTE

Breathing new life into old textiles -

AND THIS IS HOW YOU MAKE YOUR OWN FABRIC BAG

You need:


- -old fabric (from old t-shirts, pants etc.)
- -scissors
- -needle
- -thread
- -safety pin
- -cord or thicker thread.

Use differently coloured and contrasting fabrics, that will make your bag fancy and unique.




DIY:

1. Cut the fabric so that you have 2 rectangular pieces of the same size.




2. Place these pieces on top of each other so that the "nice sides" are facing each other.






3. Now sew the upper and lower fabric pieces together along the sides and bottom.

Remember to leave a one centimetre part open at the top edge on both sides.








5. Now turn everything inside out, so that the seams are on the inside!

6. Now take a piece of cord or thicker thread of your choice and thread it through the flaps you have made!



7. Now just tighten, make a bow and your little bag is ready!
